Historically, conservatives have led our country’s efforts to protect our natural resources. Conservatives conserve. When it comes to our nation’s energy future, however, we’ve allowed the conversation to be dominated by the left. Conservatives have real-world solutions to our energy challenges and contributions to make to the policy debate. It’s time we seize the opportunity before us and once again take the lead, recognizing that:

From a **faith perspective**: We have a mandate from God to be good stewards of the earth, and to protect the health and quality of life for all His children.

From an **economic perspective**: Most recessions have been sparked by fuel price spikes. Diversified energy sources protect us from volatile prices of traditional fuels. Ohio is among the top 10 states in total energy consumption, and the cost of importing traditional fuel is a drain on Ohio’s economy. Homegrown alternative energy keeps money and jobs in our state. Advanced energy businesses employ more than 25,000 Ohioans, and contribute billions of dollars annually to our economy. Ohio is poised to be a leader in a rapidly growing multi-billion dollar global advanced energy market.

From a **national security perspective**: Traditional fuel costs are set on a world market dominated by nations hostile to our country – America does not control production or consumption, and therefore does not control international pricing. It is in our nation’s interest to pursue energy security by diversifying our energy sources, reducing our energy use, pursuing and encouraging new technologies, and moving to cleaner forms of energy.

From a **public policy perspective**: Governor Kasich and the legislature are writing the next chapter of our state’s energy policy right now. Conservatives need to speak up and participate in local, state, and federal energy policy deliberations.

From a **political perspective**: Survey research shows all voters – conservatives and liberals, Democrats and Republicans – see clean, efficient energy as our future. There is great support among all voters – particularly younger moderate to conservative voters – for pursuing advanced, clean, and cost-efficient energy solutions. Republicans and conservatives must lead on these issues if we want to grow our base and be relevant to future generations of voters.

The goal of the Ohio Conservative Energy Forum is to provide a vehicle for individuals, organizations, and businesses to join the conservative conversation about Ohio’s energy future. We believe that an “all of the above” energy policy must be pursued, lowering systemic costs by increasing our commitment to developing homegrown clean energy resources and expanding energy efficiency.
